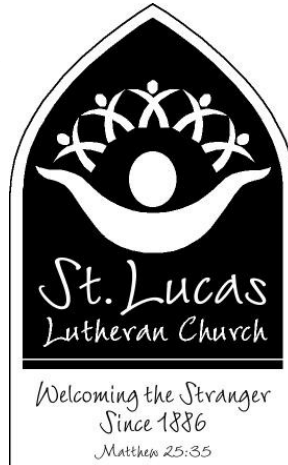
WORD IN SEASON devotional books for October, November & December have arrived at last! Now available free on the narthex tables for your use as a daily devotional.
