REFORMATION DAY is on Halloween, because it was on "All Hallow's Eve", October 31, that Martin Luther nailed 95 theses disputing the sale of indulgences to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. Thanks to the recent invention of the printing press Luther's scholarly proposal was distributed throughout Europe and the Protestant Reformation was sparked. We remember on Reformation Day that Luther's reform movement was never intended to form a new church, but to reform the Church Catholic from within. Lutherans continue to seek ecumenical partnerships with both Roman Catholics and other Protestants seeking to reunite the church around the Word and Sacraments.
