REFORMATION SUNDAY is October 29. This year is the 500th anniversary of Luther nailing 95 theses disputing the sale of indulgences to the church door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany, the



act that sparked the Protestant Reformation.

At St. Lucas the choir will present two anthems "We Have Built This House on Grace" and "Salvation Unto Us Has Come" (in German) to mark the day. The sermon that weekend will examine how 500 years later the church is already in the next Reformation—a tumultuous time that *shakes us up to see with new eyes*.

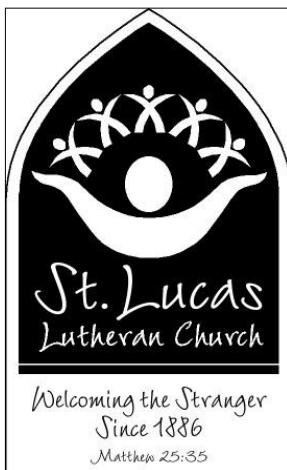
