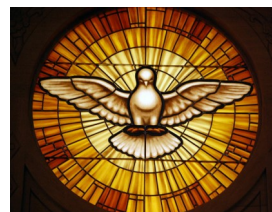

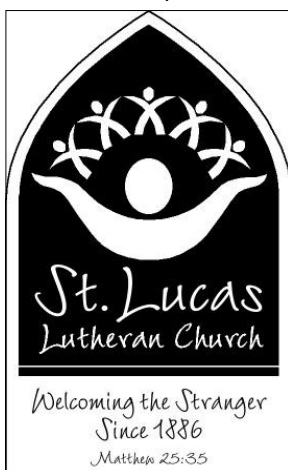

and we have some compost to spread on
the beds to feed next season's veggies.

chopped leaves as you folks bring your bags
of leaves to the garden. Stop by and give us
