**ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL** Relationships are often difficult, and feelings get hurt. Something happened in St. Paul's relationship with a member of the church in Corinth - something that caused great pain. St. Paul says, "I wrote you out of much distress and anguish of heart and with many tears, not to cause you pain, but to let you know the abundant love that I have for you." Paul chose to express his pain, not in anger, but as an expression of love. Paul understood that the depth of his hurt was also a measure of the depth of his love. He chose to reveal his hurt so the Corinthians would understand how deeply he loved them. Paul had the strength to appear weak and to be vulnerable. Paul writes "if anyone has caused pain, he has caused it not to me, but to ... all of you." The hurt between individuals affects everyone in the community. Rather than wanting to get even with this person, Paul tells the community, "you should forgive and console him, so that he may not be overwhelmed by excessive sorrow. So I urge you to reaffirm your love for him." Paul calls the community to loving forgiveness. He shares his hurt

as an expression of love and calls for forgiveness as a further expression of love.

Come and join us as we continue to study St. Paul's writings, now in II Corinthians.
