AGENCY (NODA) is holding its first "Protecting & Maintaining Your Home from Financial Disaster & Predictable Wear and Tear Workshop at the South Toledo Branch Library, 1736 Broadway, Toledo, OH 43.609 on Tuesday, Sept. 9,2014 for 6-8pm. This workshop is focused on providing existing homeowners with information and tools to prevent mort-

gage delinquency and foreclosure through education, counseling and financial assistance in a limited number of cases. In addition, the workshop will discuss the importance of homeowner's insurance, budgeting, savings as well as the availability of current grants and affordable loans to assist in making routine repairs to the physical structure in order to maintain home's market value and livability. Lastly, there will be a discussion on how to prepare painted surfaces in a lead-safe manner to prevent lead poisoning of your family and pets. ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL St. Paul is the most prolific New Testament writer, accounting for roughly half of the New Testament books. Paul had great influence on Martin Luther's thinking, even as he influenced St. Augustine before him. The adult Sunday school class read and discussed Paul's early writings last year. This year we will be reading and discussing Paul's later and pseudonymous writings beginning with Paul's Letter to the Romans. As far as we know, Paul's Letter to the Romans is the only letter he wrote to a community he had not founded. It is Paul's letter of introduction to people who did not know him, and so Paul lays out his thinking to convince them he knows his stuff. Romans contains the clearest statement of Paul's understanding of faith. This makes Romans one of the most interesting and important works in the New Testament. Come and join us as we continue to study St. Paul's writings starting **September 14th at 9:30** in the Community Room on the second floor of the Sunday School building, 2nd floor.
