### **Endings and Beginnings**

It always happens around this time of year: we look back on the year past, and we look forward to the new year. Advent leads us from where we are to where we seek to be in the birth of Christ our redeemer. We walk through the prophesies of the Old Testament with eyes to the future—a future with Jesus in our midst, and a future with God's Kindom fulfilled at the second coming.

In the Gospel of John's introduction, we hear the retelling of God's presence throughout history through the lens of an author who witnessed the promises of God fulfilled. John tells of the revelation of Jesus—God Incarnate—to a weary and waiting world.

As you journey through Advent, let the year end festivities lead you into a new year of beginnings devoted to the One who lived, died, and rose again for your life.



### A Stewardship Devotion by Norman Visser

<sup>26</sup> "Just as it was in the days of Noah, so also will it be in the days of the Son of Man. <sup>27</sup> People were eating, drinking, marrying and being given in marriage up to the day Noah entered the ark. Then the flood came and destroyed them all.—Luke 17:26-27

This Christmas Eve stores will be filled with people looking to buy something—anything—for some of their closest family members. If asked why they waited till Christmas Eve, some will claim they enjoy the rush that comes with last-minute shopping. Others will offer different reasons, but many will just say they have been too busy. Doing -other things, they have had no time to shop, and now it is Christmas Eve.

Jesus warns us that people will be busy on the day of his coming. People will be busy in the way they were in the days of Noah and Lot. When Jesus says this, he does not say that people in those days were busy being wicked. Jesus says that people were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, buying and selling, planting and building. They were going about their daily lives and were busy doing everyday sorts of things.

We often keep ourselves busy in similar ways even when we know a special deadline is approaching. We know that Christmas is coming, but we still leave some of our preparations to the last minute because we are "so busy."

In this Advent season, may we set aside our busyness and simply enjoy the gifts God has given us. May we be ready to rest in God's goodness as we celebrate the birth of Jesus. Our stewardship is necessary for the ministry of the church, but so is stewardship of our own souls and bodies. May this season be a time to rest and enjoy the life and fellowship of God and community.

Gracious God, the day is almost upon us. Forgive us for leaving some things undone. Guide us toward healthier lives, and help us to rest in your grace and to receive the joy of your salvation revealed in Jesus. Amen.
